THE WHITE HOUSE

LONDON



The White House is based on a palace in Poland, which was owned by Prince John Zylinski's grandmother.

Prince Zylinski was born in London on 25th July 1951. The title holds no power in Poland, but the Prince is the heir to the hereditary aristocratic title, going back to 1224.

His family was just one of the many royal families chased out of Poland during the Second World War. His grandmother was expelled from the family palace in Gozdowoby by the Communist Government, who then burned the building to the ground. After a spell in a Concentration Camp, she escaped to London.

Young John, brought up on stories of this wonderful Polish Palace, made a promise his grandmother when he was 6 years old to rebuild it. Prince John kept his promise to his grandmother and the White House construction was completed in May 2009.

Celebrities including Rita Ora, Britney Spears, Victoria Beckham, Rihanna and Leona Lewis, as well as multiple fashion magazines and designers have had photoshoots and fashion shows at the palace; and British TV drama - Secret Diary of a Call Girl - was filmed there, among others.

It has hosted many charitable events for organisations including Knights of Malta, Alzheimer Society, Polish Cultural Foundation. It is often a preferred venue for opera concerts and ballet performances.

On September 12, 2014, the day of the 75th anniversary of the cavalry charge, Prince Zylinski, alongside President of Poland, Bronisław Komorowski, unveiled a 30-foot statue in honour of his father, a Polish war hero Andrzej Zylinski. The statue named The Gold Horseman was created in recognition of his father's victorious cavalry charge against the Germans, as they invaded Poland in 1939.

Lieutenant Andrzej Zylinski, then aged 29, led a squadron of 88 horsemen (of whom 33 died in the bloody charge) wiping out the German 44th Infantry Regiment, but liberating Kaluszyn - and saving thousands of Jews in the process.

The celebrations included a re-enactment of the charge, with a specialist squadron dressed in Second World War uniforms.
